Caution: The stalks (stems) - the part you want to eat are safe, but the rhubarb leaves contain oxalate which is toxic in large quantities. When harvesting, remove the leaves from the stalks and wash well. Teach children the safe parts to eat and keep an eye on pets in the garden. Avoid rhubarb that has frost damage as the oxalate may have leached from the leaves into the stalk.

Rhubarb is easy to grow and maintain and exceptionally hardy to -40°C (-40°F) Zone 3, which makes it suited for many Canadian climates.

Plant rhubarb in the early spring in well-draining and fertile soil. Choose a full sun or partially shaded location. Space rhubarb plants 60-90 cm (24-36") apart in rows 90-100 cm (36-40") apart. Dig holes extra large and mix composted manure and organic fertilizers into the soil. Plant with the crown just above soil level. Firm the soil around the roots but keep it loose over the crown. Water in well. A top dressing of 5-10-10 fertilizer can applied at the time of planting.

Pick minimal amounts the first year of growth. A full harvest may be enjoyed in the second year of growth.
